

Vietnam Birding & Wildlife Photography Expedition (18 Days)



Introduction

Join renowned birder and wildlife photographer Sean Braine for an unforgettable 18-day journey through Vietnam's most biodiverse regions. This expertly guided tour is tailored for birders and photographers eager to capture stunning images of Vietnam's endemic birds, elusive pittas, and endangered primates like Delacour's Langur, Red-Shanked Douc Langur, Black-Shanked Douc Langur, and Yellow-Cheeked Gibbon.

Designed for maximum photographic opportunities, 70% of our time will be spent at strategically located bird hides, ensuring excellent views and the chance to capture incredible images of Vietnam's avian and mammalian treasures. The remaining 30% will involve exploring scenic birding trails to seek out species that don't visit feeders, including trogons, barbets, sunbirds, and other classic tropical birds.

This tour combines breathtaking landscapes, expert guidance, and a focus on rare wildlife, making it the ultimate Vietnam birding and photography experience.

Day 1: Hanoi City (Capital) – Arrival

Welcome to Vietnam. Upon your arrival at Noi Bai Airport in Hanoi, our team will greet and assist you with your transfer to the hotel. The rest of the day is yours to relax and prepare for the exciting journey ahead. In the evening, join us for a welcome dinner where you'll meet your guide and fellow travelers.

Depending on your time of arrival you may choose to explore Hanoi, a vibrant blend of ancient tradition and modern dynamism. The city's charm lies in its well-preserved colonial architecture, bustling street markets, and centuries-old temples. Stroll through the maze-like streets of the Old Quarter to experience the city's pulse, where each alley offers unique crafts, food stalls, and shops.

Visitors can enjoy a serene walk around Hoan Kiem Lake, visit the historic Ho Chi Minh Mausoleum, and explore the Temple of Literature, a testament to Vietnam's rich scholarly traditions. Hanoi's culinary scene is a feast for the senses, with famous dishes like pho (noodle soup) and bun cha (grilled pork with noodles) that you can savor at local eateries.

Day 2: Hanoi – Cuc Phuong National Park

We'll start the day early, heading to Cuc Phuong National Park, Vietnam's first national park, established in 1962. Known for its lush forests and incredible biodiversity, Cuc Phuong offers a fantastic introduction to Vietnam's wildlife. Upon arrival, we'll dive straight into exploring the park's scenic trails, taking in its unique limestone karst landscapes and diverse birdlife.

Cuc Phuong National Park: Located in northern Vietnam, Cuc Phuong is the country's oldest national park and a biodiversity hotspot. It encompasses limestone karsts, lush primary forests, and over 300 bird species, including the rare red-collared woodpecker and bar-bellied pitta. The park's dense

vegetation and abundant wildlife also attract mammals such as langurs and civets. Birders will enjoy the park's birding trails, especially in the early morning, while photographers will appreciate the dramatic limestone landscapes and diverse flora.

Day 3: Discovering the Birds of Cuc Phuong National Park

Today, we dedicate the entire day to the captivating wildlife of Cuc Phuong. Our focus will be on bird hides, where we aim to photograph some of the park's most sought-after species, including the Barbellied Pitta, Blue-rumped Pitta, and the elusive Tonkin Partridge. For those eager to explore further, we'll venture onto birding trails in search of gems like the Greyish Limestone-babbler and Fork-tailed Sunbird.

Expected birds in Cuc Phuong Bird Hides: Bar-bellied Pitta (Near Endemic), Blue-rumped Pitta (Near Endemic), Tonkin Partridge (Endemic - Subspecies), Rufous-throated Fulvetta, Siberian Thrush, Orange-headed Thrush, Japanese Thrush, White-tailed Flycatcher, Fujian Niltava, Rufous-tailed Robin, and many more.

Day 4: Cuc Phuong National Park – Van Long Nature Reserve

We'll begin the day with some final birding at Cuc Phuong National Park, making the most of this exceptional site before departing for Van Long Nature Reserve. Just a short drive away, Van Long is a vast and picturesque wetland renowned for its rich biodiversity and dramatic limestone karst formations.

Here, we'll have the rare opportunity to spot one of Vietnam's most endangered and iconic primates, the Delacour's Langur, in its natural habitat. This species, found only in Vietnam, is a highlight for wildlife enthusiasts and photographers alike. As the day winds down, enjoy the serene beauty of this tranquil reserve.

Van Long Nature Reserve: Known as "the bay without waves," Van Long is a stunning wetland in northern Vietnam. Its tranquil marshes and karst peaks provide a haven for waterbirds, including the endangered Delacour's langur and rare birds like the white-browed crake and purple heron. Birders can explore by boat, gliding through serene waters alive with dragonflies, butterflies, and flocks of waders. The reserve's reflections and vibrant wildlife make it a photographer's dream.

Day 5: Van Long Nature Reserve

Today is dedicated to uncovering the natural beauty and unique wildlife of Van Long Nature Reserve, the largest wetland reserve in northern Vietnam. A highlight of our visit will be a serene sampan ride through the reserve's scenic waterways, gliding past dramatic limestone cliffs and tranquil marshes.

Van Long is one of the last strongholds of the critically endangered Delacour's Langur, a primate found only in northern Vietnam. Its striking black and white markings have earned it the local nickname "vooc quần đùi trắng," meaning "langur with white pants." With some luck, we'll spot and photograph these fascinating creatures in their natural habitat.

As the day comes to a close, enjoy the charm of Ninh Binh, where we'll spend the night. This is a day to savor the serene beauty of Vietnam's landscapes and its rare wildlife.

Expected birds: White-browed Crake, Cinnamon Bittern, Yellow Bittern, Pheasant-tailed Jacana, Eurasian

Coot, Grey-headed Swamphen, egrets, herons...

Day 6: Van Long Nature Reserve – Son Tra Nature Reserve (Da Nang City)

This morning, we'll journey back to Hanoi to catch a domestic flight to Da Nang City, located in central Vietnam. Upon arrival, we'll begin our exploration of the stunning Son Tra Nature Reserve, a lush haven for wildlife perched along the coastline.

Son Tra is home to one of the world's most striking and colorful primates, the Red-Shanked Douc Langur. Known as the "Queen of Primates," this species is a true marvel for wildlife enthusiasts and photographers, with its vibrant fur and graceful movements.

As the day draws to a close, we'll return to Da Nang City for the night, reflecting on the beauty of Son Tra and its extraordinary inhabitants.

Son Tra Nature Reserve: Located near Da Nang, the Son Tra Peninsula is a tropical haven for birders and photographers. Its forests are home to the charismatic Red-Shanked Douc Langur, Green-Backed Tit, and Crested Serpent Eagle. The reserve's elevated trails offer panoramic views of the coastline and diverse habitats ranging from coastal scrub to montane forests. Dawn and dusk provide perfect lighting for capturing wildlife against dramatic seascapes.

Day 7: Son Tra Nature Reserve

Today, we'll dedicate a full day to discovering the natural wonders of Son Tra Nature Reserve, a breathtaking peninsula just a short drive from Da Nang City. Known for its unique combination of coastal and forest ecosystems, Son Tra offers stunning landscapes and exceptional biodiversity.

After a rewarding day in the reserve, we'll return to Da Nang City for the night.

Day 8: Son Tra Nature Reserve – Ho Chi Minh City

We'll begin the day with one final morning outing at Son Tra Nature Reserve, focusing on spotting and photographing the iconic Red-Shanked Douc Langur. This is an excellent chance to capture any last images of these vibrant primates in the serene morning light.

Later, we'll transfer to Da Nang Airport for a domestic flight to Ho Chi Minh City, Vietnam's bustling southern metropolis. Upon arrival, settle in and enjoy the lively atmosphere of the city for the evening.

Day 9: Ho Chi Minh City – Ma Da forest – Cat Tien National Park

We'll begin the day with a drive to Ma Da Forest, located just 2.5 hours from Ho Chi Minh City. This biodiverse area is an excellent birding stop between the city and Cat Tien National Park. At the bird hides in Ma Da, we'll focus on photographing some of the region's most sought-after species, including the Indochinese Green Magpie, Bar-bellied Pitta, Blue-rumped Pitta, Silver-breasted Broadbill, and Indochinese Babbler.

In the afternoon, we'll continue to Cat Tien National Park, the largest remaining lowland rainforest in Vietnam. Known as one of the country's premier birding destinations, Cat Tien boasts an astonishing diversity of wildlife, with over 350 recorded bird species. We'll arrive with enough time to begin our first exploration of this incredible park.

Expected birds in Ma Da Bird Hides: Indochinese Green Magpie, Bar-bellied Pitta (near endemic), Bluerumped Pitta (near endemic), Silver-breasted Broadbill, Laced Woodpecker, Indochinese Babbler, Puffthroated Babbler, Buff-breasted Babbler, Abbott's Babbler, Black-crested Bulbul, Stripe-throated Bulbul, Gray-eyed Bulbul, Ochraceous Bubul, White-rumped Shama, Hainan Blue Flycatcher, Indochinese Blue Flycatcher, and many more.

Ma Da Forest: Nestled in southern Vietnam, Ma Da Forest is part of the Dong Nai Biosphere Reserve. Its lowland forests and waterways attract a variety of birds, including hornbills, broadbills, and pittas like the endemic Germain's Peacock-Pheasant. The forest is also a key site for butterflies and reptiles, adding diversity for photographers. Quiet trails and early morning birding sessions offer excellent opportunities for sightings.

Day 10 + 11: Cat Tien National Park

For the next two full days, we'll immerse ourselves in the lush beauty of Cat Tien National Park, the largest remaining lowland rainforest in Vietnam and one of the country's top birding destinations. With over 350 bird species recorded, the park offers exceptional opportunities for wildlife photographers and birders alike.

During our time here, we'll spend the majority of our time at bird hides, focusing on iconic species such as the Bar-bellied Pitta, Blue-rumped Pitta, Germain's Peacock Pheasant, and Siamese Fireback. We'll also explore some of the park's birding trails in search of other stunning species like Green Peafowl, Orange-breasted Trogon, Banded Kingfisher, and various beautiful broadbills. In addition to the incredible birdlife, Cat Tien is also home to elusive primates like the Black-shanked Douc Langur and the Yellow-cheeked Gibbon, offering a rare chance to capture these endangered species in their natural habitat.

These two days in the park will provide ample opportunities for both photography and birdwatching, surrounded by the sounds and sights of Vietnam's most biodiverse rainforest.

Expected birds in Cat Tien Bird Hides: Siamese Fireback, Green-legged Partridge, Germain's Peacock-Pheasant (Near Endemic), Blue-rumped Pitta (Near Endemic), Bar-bellied Pitta (Near Endemic), Blackcrested Bulbul, Stripe-throated Bulbul, Gray-eyed Bulbul, Puff-throated Babbler, Buff-breasted Babbler, Abbott's Babbler, White-rumped Shama, Hainan Blue Flycatcher, Indochinese Blue Flycatcher, and more.

Expected birds on Cat Tien Birding Trails: Gray-faced Tit-Babbler (Near Endemic), Indochinese Babbler (Near Endemic - Subspecies), Green Peafowl, Orange-breasted Trogon, Banded Kingfisher, Black-and-red Broadbill, Banded Broadbill, woodpeckers, sunbirds, to mention a few. **Expected mammals**: Black-shanked Douc Langur, Yellow-cheeked Gibbon. **Cat Tien National Park:** A sprawling sanctuary in southern Vietnam, Cat Tien is renowned for its rich biodiversity. It supports over 350 bird species, including the orange-necked partridge and Germain's peacock-pheasant, and is a stronghold for endangered species like gibbons and sun bears. Its mix of wetlands, grasslands, and forests offers varied photography settings, with birds, butterflies, and mammals in abundance. Boat tours and night safaris provide unique perspectives for capturing nocturnal creatures.

Day 12: Cat Tien National Park – Da Lat Plateau

After a final morning of birding in the lush forests of Cat Tien National Park, we'll embark on a scenic drive north to the Da Lat Plateau. This area is renowned for its high-altitude habitats and is home to a wealth of endemic species, making it one of Vietnam's top birding destinations. Upon arrival, we'll dive straight into our exploration of this remarkable region, known for its cooler climate and diverse birdlife.

The Da Lat Plateau is a hotspot for endemic species and specialties, offering unparalleled opportunities for birdwatchers and photographers. Enjoy a relaxing evening in Da Lat City, preparing for two full days of birding in this birding paradise.

Day 13 + 14: Da Lat Plateau

Over the next two full days, we'll explore the exceptional birding sites and bird hides of the Da Lat Plateau, one of Vietnam's most unique and rewarding birding regions. The cool, misty forests and highaltitude landscapes provide the perfect backdrop for capturing some of the country's most soughtafter species.

In the bird hides, our main targets will include the stunning Collared Laughingthrush (endemic to the region) and the elusive Rusty-naped Pitta. We will also venture into the surrounding birding sites around Da Lat to seek out additional highlights, including the Dalat Shrike-Babbler, Vietnamese Cutia, Langbian Sunbird, and Vietnamese Greenfinch, all of which are endemic to Vietnam or the Da Lat Plateau. Other specialties such as the Red Crossbill and Annam Sunbird (a near-endemic subspecies) are also on our list.

With the plateau's unique habitats and incredible birdlife, these two days will offer abundant opportunities for birdwatching and photography. Enjoy the cooler mountain air and capture some of the most beautiful and rare birds in Vietnam. Nights will be spent in the charming city of Da Lat.

Da Lat Plateau: The Da Lat Plateau in central Vietnam is a montane paradise for birders and naturalists. Its pine forests and cool climate are home to numerous endemic species, including the Vietnamese Greenfinch and The Black-Crowned Fulvetta. The area's high-altitude wetlands and forests also harbor rare orchids, insects, and small mammals. Photographers will find the mist-shrouded landscapes and unique flora particularly inspiring.

Day 15: Da Lat Plateau – Deo Nui San (Di Linh)

After a final morning of birding in the scenic Da Lat Plateau, we'll drive south to Di Linh, a charming town nestled at the edge of the Deo Nui San area. Upon arrival, we'll head straight into the Deo Nui San region, known for its diverse ecosystems and rich birdlife. This area offers fantastic opportunities to spot a variety of species, many of which are difficult to find elsewhere in Vietnam.

We'll begin our exploration in the afternoon, focusing on the unique birds and habitats that make this area a hidden gem for birders and photographers alike. After a rewarding day, we'll spend the night in Di Linh Town, ready for another day of birding tomorrow.

Deo Nui San Pass: Deo Nui San, near Da Lat, is a well-known birding site with dense forests that support a range of highland bird species. It's an excellent location for spotting rarities like the Collared Laughingthrush and Yellow-Billed Nuthatch. For wildlife photographers, the pass offers breathtaking vistas of the surrounding forests, with opportunities to capture elusive species in their natural habitats.

Day 16: Deo Nui San (Di Linh)

Today we'll dedicate the entire day to exploring the diverse habitats of Deo Nui San, a scenic mountain pass surrounded by impressive forested hills. This area is a prime location for finding some of Vietnam's most sought-after bird species.

Our primary targets will include the stunning Annam Priania (endemic to the region), the striking Blackheaded Parrotbill (near endemic), the elusive Blue-rumped Pitta (near endemic), and the vibrant Blue Pitta. With its rich birdlife and breathtaking landscapes, Deo Nui San offers ample opportunities for birdwatchers and photographers to capture rare and beautiful species.

After a full day of birding, we'll return to Di Linh Town for a well-deserved rest, ready for another day of exploration.

Expected birds in Di Linh Bird Hides: Blue Pitta, Blue-rumped Pitta (Near Endemic), Black-headed Parrotbill (Near Endemic), Silver-breasted Broadbill, White-bellied Erpornis, Ochraceous Bulbul, Brown-backed Bulbul (Near Endemic - Subspecies), White-browed Scimitar-Babbler, Buff-breasted Babbler, Siberian Thrush, Orange-headed Thrush, Hainan Blue Flycatcher, White-throated Rock-Thrush, etc.

Expected birds on Di Linh Birding Trails: Annam Priania (Endemic), Red-vented Barbet (Near Endemic), Long-tailed Broadbill, and many more.

Day 17: Deo Nui San (Di Linh) – Ho Chi Minh City

After a final morning of birding at Deo Nui San, where we'll make the most of any remaining birding opportunities, we'll begin our journey back to Ho Chi Minh City. The drive offers a chance to reflect on the incredible birding experiences we've had over the past days.

Upon arrival in Ho Chi Minh City, we will spend the rest of the day relaxing and preparing for our departure the following day.

Day 18: Tour Concludes with International Departure from Ho Chi Minh City

Today will be a non-birding day. The tour concludes with your departure from Tan Son Nhat International Airport, Ho Chi Minh City anytime during the day. Please note that breakfast is included today but no other meals are included. Please note that hotel check-out is at noon; if you wish to stay beyond this time, additional fees may apply, subject to the hotel's availability.
